11) New Business

A) Tuition & Fees for 2026-2027: Dr. K Beardmore – As the college begins work on the budget for the next fiscal year, Dr. Beardmore presented two options to the Trustees for tuition and fees. The first is to leave things as they are. The second option is to increase tuition and fees by up to 3% based on information from the Higher Education Department and the Legislative Finance Committee that increases greater than 3% would not be granted Opportunity Scholarship funds. He added that raising tuition and fees by 3% provides just \$29-31K in additional revenue. The Trustees agreed that they do not want to increase tuition and fees.

Cage, Elkins, White, and Bowman voted in favor of keeping 2026-27 tuition and fees at the same rate as they are currently.

B) Resolution for the Disposal of Surplus Property: Carolyn Kasdorf - Interim Vice President of Business and Finance Carolyn Kasdorf presented a resolution to dispose of surplus property according to the list provided to the Trustees.

Cage, Elkins, White, and Bowman voted in favor of this resolution.

C) Monthly Financial Report: Carolyn Kasdorf – Carolyn Kasdorf presented financial reports for the period ending December 31, 2025. Per this report SENMC is projecting an additional \$9,583,542 in revenue and \$3,347,593 in expenses (a difference of \$6,235,949) and will be processing budget adjustments to the New Mexico Higher Education Department to account for these projections. Ms. Kasdorf also presented an investment report for the second quarter (October 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.) The total market value of the college's investments as of December 31, 2025 is \$49,923,051 with a weighted average yield of 3.73%.

D) Quarterly Financial Report: Carolyn Kasdorf – Ms. Kasdorf presented the quarterly financial actions report and quarterly certification for approval.

12) Executive administration staff reports or comments - Representatives reported on the following:

A) Dr. Effrosyni "Frosso" Seitaridou, VP of Academic Affairs: The Allied Health Department is advertising and preparing for the return of the Medical Assistant program in 2026-2027. During the week of January 12-16 Dr. Huang (Natural Sciences and Engineering Department) organized a chemistry winter bootcamp for Introduction to Chemistry Lecture and Lab for non-majors. The Higher Learning Commission has approved the new Radiation Protection Technology program, and it is ready to be included in the 2026-2027 catalog.

- B) **Carolyn Kasdorf, Interim VP-Business and Finance:** Ms. Kasdorf reported that she has finalized the paperwork for PFM (Public Finance Management), an investment firm for asset management, and expects to open an account on March 1.
- C) **Diana Campos, Dean of Student Affairs:** Ms. Campos reviewed the enrollment report. As of February 5, registration is closed and 1,759 students are enrolled. The FTE (Full Time Equivalent) is 765 in Spring '26 versus 615 in Spring '25. She explained that there is a higher dual credit population this year.
- D) **Chris Spaulding, Interim VP of Workforce Development and Community Engagement:** Misty McCormack, Director of Adult Education presented the report on behalf of Chris Spaulding. Southeast New Mexico College has signed an MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with Artesia Truck Driving School, and the first class begins on February 17. Chris Spaulding attended the Legislative Finance Committee dinner in Santa Fe on January 29. He has toured the ABC (Associated Builders and Contractors) facility in Albuquerque for the Electrical Apprenticeship program and received advice and tips for creating a program at SENMC. He has met with a senior recruiter and the state apprenticeship director at NM Department of Workforce Solutions on the State Apprenticeship Council to move forward with SENMC's Electrical Apprenticeship program. Mr. Spaulding attended the ExxonMobil University Ribbon Cutting and went to Rotary twice in January. Nine candidates are registered for the spring RCT session and three for the summer session. Additionally, RCT has established and implemented math tutoring for prospective students. The Work-Based Learning Department is procuring equipment and developing positions and planning for the Nondestructive Testing program. Dr. Monty Harris is working with a senior recruiter and the state apprenticeship director at NM Department of Workforce Solutions on the State Apprenticeship Council approval process for SENMC's Electrical Apprenticeship program. They have submitted a proposal to the Permian Basin Association of Pipeliners for feedback on a Continuing Professional Development (CPD) program and are collaborating with Grant Services to establish the campus career center. The Mosaic partnership and the Drone Soccer program (Workforce Training) are going well. The American Heart Association First Aid/CPR courses appear to be the most popular of the courses featured in the new Workforce Training catalog. Board Secretary Dr. Ned Elkins commented that he is really impressed with the Workforce catalog. The JSS (Joe Stanley Smith) Workforce Training team gave food to more than 75 families at a food distribution event at the SENMC Workforce Training Center at JSS. Board Chair Sarah Bowman was there to assist. Workforce Partnerships is working with ExxonMobil with training offerings. Adult Education finished spring enrollment with 278 students, a 20% increase over last year. Community Education reported that spring classes are going great. They are adding the Soft Skills program to the Adult 101 course, developing mental health and team building classes for Lifehouse, and working on the summer schedule which will offer the NMPED Reading program again this year, as well as a variety of kids camps and adult classes. They are working with IT to set up Excel classes that have been requested by the City of Carlsbad and by oilfield companies.
- E) **Tymon Mattoszko, CIO:** Things are going pretty much as planned. They are launching their Raspberry Pi program with the high school this week. They are looking forward to having a presentation for the STEAM event in April. Mr. Mattoszko said it will include lasers and motors.

- 13) **HR Report: Dr. K Beardmore for Steven Gonzales, HR Director:** The employee count for SENMC as of February 5 is 289 employees. This includes full-time, part-time, temporary, and student employees. Dr. Beardmore introduced new employees David Baber and Joseph Garza, who work in the Simulator Lab, and Brianna Bitner, Nursing Department Coordinator. There are currently nine faculty and seven staff vacancies. February 2026's Employee of the Month is Teddi Garcia, Academic Advisor, Lead, who was also present.

- A) **Faculty:** Rick Wiedenmann announced that RiverBlitz will be on Saturday, March 7. Volunteers wanting to carpool to the worksite on the Hwy 31 bridge should meet at SENMC at 7 am, prepared to leave. Otherwise, meet at the bridge at 7:30 am. Energy Day, which had been postponed last fall, will be on April 20. There will be speakers and representatives from several energy companies.

The group met on January 28 and have created a sub-committee whose project is to develop a resource guide for new employees.

Colleges and Branches by County



21-13-2. Definitions.

As used in the Community College Act:

A. "community college" means a public educational institution that provides not to exceed two years of training in the arts, sciences and humanities beyond the twelfth grade of the public high school curriculum or, in lieu of that training or in addition to it, not to exceed two years of a vocational and technical curriculum and appropriate courses of study for persons who may or may not have completed the twelfth grade of public high school;

B. "community college district" means a district in which a community college is located, which district is composed of the territory of one or more school districts of the state. For the purposes of relating community college districts to existing law, community college districts and the community colleges thereof shall not:

(1) be considered a part of the uniform system of free public schools pursuant to Article 12, Section 1 and Article 21, Section 4 of the constitution of New Mexico;

(2) benefit from the permanent school fund and from the current school fund under Article 12, Sections 2 and 4 of the constitution of New Mexico;

(3) be subject, except as it relates to technical and vocational education, to the control, management and direction of the state board of education under Article 12, Section 6 of the constitution of New Mexico; and

(4) be considered school districts insofar as the restrictions of Article 9, Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico are concerned; and

C. "qualified elector" means a person otherwise eligible to vote within the community college district.

21-13-10. Board duties.

A. It is the duty of the community college board to determine financial and educational policies of the community college. The community college board shall provide for the management of the community college and execution of these policies by selecting a competent president for the community college, and, upon the president's recommendation, the board shall employ other administrative personnel, instructional staff or other personnel as may be needed for the operation, maintenance and administration of the community college.

B. The community college board shall have the power to fix tuition and fee rates for resident and nonresident students of the community college district, to accept gifts, to accept federal aid, to purchase, hold, sell and rent property and equipment and to promote the general welfare of the institution for the best interest of educational service to the people of the community college district.

21-13-21. Addition of school districts to existing community college districts.

A. The school board of a school district, group of school districts within a county or school districts in an adjoining county, not included in the community college district as originally formed, may by resolution petition the higher education department to be added to the community college district. The resolution may be initiated by the school board or upon presentation to the school board of a petition signed by ten percent of the qualified electors of the district.

B. In reviewing the resolution, the higher education department shall ascertain the attitude of the community college board and ensure that the petitioning district is not already within another institution's service area. If the department finds that the proposed addition of the petitioning district is not within another institution's service area and the proposed addition is acceptable to the community college district, it shall approve the resolution. Thereafter, the petitioning district and the established community college district shall call an election pursuant to the provisions of the Local Election Act [Chapter 1, Article 22 NMSA 1978] on the question of the inclusion of the area in the community college district.

C. If it appears on canvass of the results of the election a majority of the votes cast in each of the petitioning areas and within the established community college district was in favor of the addition of the petitioning area, the secretary of higher education shall declare the extension of the boundaries of the community college district to include the petitioning area in which the proposed addition referendum carried by a majority vote. The addition shall take effect on the next succeeding July 1.

D. The territory within each school district added to any existing community college district shall automatically be subject to any special levy on taxable property approved for the community college district for the maintenance of facilities and services and for support of bond issues.

21-13-24.1. Establishing procedures for independence; funding; tuition; appropriation; local support level; outstanding indebtedness.

Any institution established in accordance with Chapter 21, Article 14 or 16 NMSA 1978 that desires to become an independent institution pursuant to the Community College Act and to receive more than three hundred twenty-five dollars (\$325) per full-time-equivalent student is subject to the following:

A. approval of the institutional request for independent status by the commission on higher education [higher education department];

B. tuition rates shall be recommended by the commission on higher education [higher education department] and shall be set by the community college board;

C. the commission on higher education [higher education department] shall recommend an appropriation for the institution based upon expenditure levels determined by commission [department] formulas in relation to its authorized program and its available funds from nongeneral fund sources, and the recommended appropriation shall be an amount not less than three hundred twenty-five dollars (\$325) for each full-time-equivalent student;

D. the minimum level of local support for operational purposes shall be a tax rate of two dollars (\$2.00), or any lower amount required by the operation of the rate limitation provisions of Section 7-37-7.1 NMSA 1978 upon an amount of at least two dollars (\$2.00) on each one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of net taxable value, as that term is defined in the Property Tax Code [Chapter 7, Articles 35 to 38 NMSA 1978]; and

E. the community college board shall provide for the assumption of any outstanding indebtedness of the institution desiring to become independent by the voters of the community college district.

21-2A-3. Purpose.

The purpose of the College District Tax Act is to provide a uniform procedure for the authorization, imposition and collection of tax levies for the operation of college districts and the issuance of college district general obligation and revenue bonds for capital improvements in a college district.

21-2A-5. Special tax levy for college district operation.

A. In each college district, the board may call an election within the college district for the purpose of authorizing that board to levy taxes on all taxable property within the district to be used for current operations, maintenance and capital improvements of the college district. The taxes, if authorized as provided in the College District Tax Act, shall be in addition to the taxes authorized for the payment of general obligation bonds pursuant to the provisions of the College District Tax Act. This election shall be for the purpose of allowing the electors, as the term "electors" is used in Article 8, Section 2 of the constitution of New Mexico, to vote on whether to allow the levy and on a specific limitation not to exceed five dollars (\$5.00) on each one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of net taxable value, as that term is defined in the Property Tax Code [Chapter 7, Articles 35 to 38 NMSA 1978]. If approved by a majority of the electors voting on the issue, the board of county commissioners, at the direction of the board, shall levy the taxes in an amount certified by the commission on higher education [higher education department] as necessary to meet the annual budget approved by the commission on higher education [higher education department], but in no event shall the taxes levied exceed the rate limitation approved by the electors nor shall it exceed any lower maximum rate required by operation of the rate limitation provisions of Section 7-37-7.1 NMSA 1978 applied to the rate limitation approved by the electors.

B. Levies, assessments and collections and distributions authorized for college district financing shall be made at the same time and in the same manner as levies, assessments and collections and distributions for ad valorem taxes for school districts are made.

C. The board may call an election within the district for the purpose of authorizing the board to raise the levy to a rate not to exceed the maximum authorized in Subsection A of this section, lower the levy or abolish the continuing levy, upon the adoption of a resolution by a majority of the members of the board.

D. Alternatively, an election to raise or lower the rate limitation or to abolish the continuing levy shall be called by the board upon receipt by it of a valid petition. To be valid, the petition shall be signed by electors of the college district in a number equal to ten percent of the number of votes cast in the district for the office of governor at the last general election and shall state the question to be voted upon.

21-2A-10. Procedure for election.



A. In all elections held under the College District Tax Act, the board shall issue a resolution calling for an election. The resolution shall be filed with each county clerk in the college district.

B. All elections held under the College District Tax Act shall be conducted and canvassed pursuant to the provisions of the Local Election Act [Chapter 1, Article 22 NMSA 1978].

C. Any person or corporation may institute, in the district court of any county in which the college district affected lies, an action or suit to contest the validity of any proceedings held under the College District Tax Act, but no such suit or action shall be maintained unless it is instituted within ten days after the issuance by the proper official of a certificate or notification of the results of the election.

D. Alternatively, an election to raise or lower the rate limitation or to abolish the continuing levy shall be called by the board upon receipt by it of a valid petition. To be valid, the petition shall be signed by electors of the college district in a number equal to ten percent of the number of votes cast in the district for the office of governor at the last general election and shall state the question to be voted upon.

E. If the question to be voted on at an election called pursuant to Subsection D of this section fails, it shall not again be submitted to the voters within two years from the date of the election.

F. Any part of the rate authorized by the electors that is not imposed for reasons other than the rate limitation required by Section 7-37-7.1 NMSA 1978 may be authorized to be imposed by the board without calling an election.

Subject: Business Office Budget Report for the month ending January 31, 2026

Statement of Revenue and Expenditures

The statement of Revenue and Expenditures provides the Board of Trustees with a monthly snapshot in time as of 1/31/2026. This allows the Board the opportunity to track how the College's budget to actuals is performing. It also allows Management a view to adjust for areas where budget may need to be increased, decreased, or adjusted accordingly.

Per this report SENMC is projecting an additional \$9,583,542 in revenue and \$2,680,325 in expenses for a difference of \$6,903,217. SENMC will be processing budget adjustments to New Mexico Higher Education Department to account for these projections.

Balance Sheet

Please note that the balance sheet has an additional fiscal period added – FY23 (July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023) in addition to the three fiscal periods – FY24 (July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024), FY25 (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025), and FY26 (July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026). The purpose of this is our need to restate the FY23 audit to provide a complete picture of what our financial position was at that point in time.

As of January 31, 2026, our net position is projected at \$201,662,688.43 an increase of \$32,414,474.64 from an audited FY23 and FY24 balance combined. Cash has increased from \$135,302,447.99 in FY24 to \$167,658,197.41 in FY26 – an increase of \$32,355,749.42.

Income Statement

The income statement provides a snapshot of revenue and expenses. Please keep in mind that the audited balance as of 6/30/23, 6/30/24 and unaudited 6/30/25 is for the entire fiscal year. Whereas the unaudited balance as of 1/31/2026 is only for that specific point in time.





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SENMC Executive Summary – (Jan 16 – Feb 15, 2026)

Security, Risk & Compliance

- Monthly ****external vulnerability scans**** will be performed to enhance threat visibility and remediation rigor.
- Enhanced in-person cybersecurity awareness sessions are underway; ****KnowBe4**** training will be rolled out to reinforce secure behaviors

Service Desk Trends (2026-03)

Tickets Received vs Resolved vs Unresolved

Daily ticket receipts generally ranged from the mid-20s to low-40s, with resolved counts closely tracking receipts; the unresolved volume stayed low (typically low single digits), indicating healthy flow-through and limited backlog. Peaks around ~40–42 tickets/day did not create a sustained gap, suggesting capacity kept pace with demand.

Tickets by Time of Creation (Hour of Day & Channel)

Volume is concentrated during business hours (roughly 08:00–17:00), with minimal overnight activity; Email, Phone, and Portal dominate intake while Walk-up/Chat contribute marginally. This profile supports standard staffing windows and suggests limited benefit from extended off-hours coverage.

SLA Compliance

Across the observed dates, tickets resolved within SLA and those meeting first-response SLA closely mirror overall resolved volumes, indicating strong compliance discipline. First-contact resolution is present but below total resolved, highlighting opportunities to expand knowledge, scripts, or self-service to lift FCR.

Turnaround Time

Average first response is usually within hours, with occasional spikes, while average resolution time fluctuates more widely—including a few outliers exceeding a day—suggesting some complex tickets elongate cycle time. The general pattern (sub-day resolutions with rare long tails) aligns with good operational control and targeted triage for exceptions.

Employee Satisfaction (2026-03)

Tickets with Survey Sent

Surveys were dispatched on 206 tickets—about a quarter of eligible work—providing a reasonably sized solicitation pool for sentiment. Consider increasing survey triggers if broader coverage is desired.

Total Responses Received

You received 25 responses, reflecting a high response rate relative to invitations—supportive of reliable signal despite the small n. Sustaining or widening invitations could maintain this strong response ratio while increasing absolute feedback volume.

Survey Sent vs Response Received (By Week)

Responses are concentrated in single-digit counts per week and visibly skew “Happy,” with negligible neutral/unhappy reaction across the period. This distribution indicates consistent positive experience among those who responded.

Employee Satisfaction – Trend

Satisfaction is uniformly positive—100% Happy, 0% Neutral/Unhappy—across 25 responses, signaling an excellent service experience. Treat the unanimity with caution given the sample size; continue to expand outreach for robustness.

Employee Satisfaction (Agent Group – Hardware Tier 2)

Hardware Tier 2 captured the bulk of positive ratings, with feedback registering as Happy and no visible neutral/unhappy responses. This suggests effective resolution quality and communication within this group.

Employee Satisfaction by Agent Group

Across agent groups, sentiment is consistently positive and dominated by Happy responses, indicating a broadly uniform service experience. Any variance appears minor and does not introduce neutral/unhappy clusters.

Impact of Resolution Time on Employee Satisfaction

Faster resolutions (0–4h and 4–10h) correspond with the highest Happy counts, with fewer responses and no visible dissatisfaction at longer bands. This reinforces the value of rapid closure on perceived quality.

Impact of First Response Time on Employee Satisfaction

“Happy” sentiment is greatest when first response occurs within 0–1h and 1–5h windows; longer initial waits correlate with fewer responses overall. Early acknowledgment appears pivotal to positive perception.

Impact of Resolution SLA Status on Employee Satisfaction

Tickets resolved within SLA are overwhelmingly associated with Happy feedback, underscoring SLA compliance as a driver of satisfaction. Focus on edge cases breaching SLA to prevent erosion of this correlation.

Impact of First Response SLA Status on Employee Satisfaction

When first response meets SLA, sentiment skews Happy with minimal to no neutral/unhappy feedback. Maintaining prompt acknowledgment standards should continue to pay dividends in CSAT.

Survey Results by Choice

Respondents selected primarily “Very Good,” with remaining votes for “Good,” indicating top-box concentration. This pattern aligns with the 100% Happy trend in overall sentiment.

Average Survey Score – Trend

Average score remains stably near the ceiling (~3.9–4.0 on a 4-point scale) week-over-week, reflecting consistent service quality. There is no discernible downward drift during the period.

Average Survey Score by Question

The single question averages 3.96, corroborating the near-perfect trend and indicating strong perceived experience. This stability suggests the question is well-calibrated and understood by users.

Average Survey Score by Department

All listed departments (Admissions, Business Office, Fire Science, Human Resources, Library) register at 4.0, implying uniformly strong satisfaction across campus units. While excellent, broadened sampling will help confirm sustained parity at scale.
















Impact of Resolution Time on Employee Satisfaction




Impact of First Response Time on Employee Satisfaction





Average Survey Score - Trend




Average Survey Score By Question




